The Clontarf Foundation exists to improve the education, discipline, self-esteem, life skills and employment prospects of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men and by doing so, equips them to participate more meaningfully in society.



Clontarf provides an important school-engagement mechanism for many at-risk, teenage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander male students who would otherwise not attend or have very low school attendance.

Full-time, locally-based Clontarf staff mentor and counsel students on a range of behavioural and lifestyle issues through a rich, holistic programme designed to engage and retain the students back into the education system.

In 2019, Clontarf supports more than 8,100 students (including 670 Year 12s) in Western Australia, the Northern Territory, Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia.

What is Workplace Giving?

Workplace Giving provides you with the opportunity to make small, regular donations through your pre-tax pay directly to the Clontarf Foundation.

- Your donation is pre-tax - the amount you donate to Clontarf is taken out of your pay automatically, so there is no need to keep receipts for tax time.
- Your employer may match your donation, meaning Clontarf receives double the benefit.
- There is no minimum or maximum donation required.
- Workplace Giving doesn't affect the way your gross income, super guarantee payments or fringe benefits are worked out.
- It's simple to set up - your workplace payroll team organises and maintains it.

The donations we receive from Workplace Giving go directly into our academies and help to provide our boys with exposure to:

- Activities that encourage them to come to school each day and complete Year 12.
- Activities that build their confidence and inspire them to become leaders at school, in their communities and within their families.
- A dedicated team of experienced mentors who guide and help them through the many challenges they face.
- Health checks and health awareness sessions that promote healthy life decisions.
- Opportunities that assist them to transition from school into employment or further education.
